FEMA GRANT:

 The Chief got a quote from Municipal Emergency Services, Inc. (MES) for the Compressor.

Option #1 – Revolvair 2 x 2 refill system, 7.5 HP, 6000 PSI. Allows you to have two more bottles ready to fill while others are filling \$33,200.68.

Option #2 – Simple Air – Guardian refill station.

This is a two-bottle cascade system, 6000 PSI system. You can fill at least 24 bottles from this station. Price is \$31,633.39.

The revolvair system will fill and shut off by itself and the compressor will keep them full at all times. It will take about 6-8 weeks for delivery; then the Chief will contact the electrician.

A motion was made to order the Option #1 revolvaire filling system from MES by Commissioner Harned, seconded by Commissioner Saulpaugh. All in favor. So carried.

- The Chief has not received the specs for the pressure washer that he would like.
- Received the Marine radio and there are weather channels, coast guard and Columbia County Sheriffs channels.

A motion was made to accept the Chiefs report by Commissioner Harned, seconded by Commissioner Saulpaugh. All in favor. So carried.

A motion was made to pay the bills by Commissioner Saulpaugh, seconded by Commissioner Harned. All in favor. So carried.

A motion was made to go into executive session at 8:25 P.M. to discuss information relating to current or future investigation or prosecution of a criminal offense, which would imperil effective law enforcement if disclosed by Commissioner Harned, seconded by Commissioner Saulpaugh. All in favor. So carried.

A motion was made to come out of executive session at 8:45 P.M. by Commissioner Harned, seconded by Commissioner Bauer. All in favor. So carried.

A motion was made to adjourn at 8:45 P.M. by Commissioner Harned, seconded by Commissioner Saulpaugh. All in favor. So carried.
